

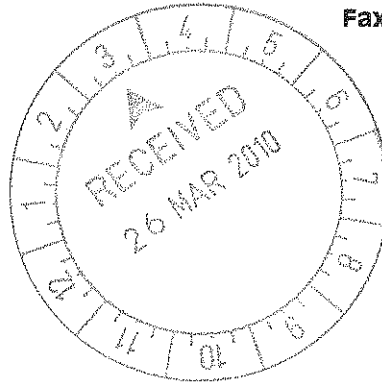

Soula was referred to me on the 13th of July 2006 and at that time she was undergoing fertility treatment and I subsequently performed a D&C and Mirena insertion in November 2006.

She returned to see me the following month and I prescribed Voltaren suppositories for some cramping pain.

I did not see Soula until the 29th of February 2008 when she came to see me having had a history of a low back injury and was on anti-depressants and Analgesics. She was still complaining of intermittent painful periods and I removed her Mirena at that time.

Soula returned on the 30th of April 2009, complaining of pelvic pressure, especially before a bowel movement and at that time I noted that she had an acutely retroverted uterus and discussed with her whether her symptoms were enough to warrant a laparoscopy which she requested.

On the 4th of May 2009, I performed a D&C and laparoscopy. At that time a very thickened rectovaginal septum was noted, which may have been responsible for her rectal symptoms and she had a thickened left uterosacral ligament also. I resected the septum

There was no evidence of endometriosis on histopathology and I reviewed Soula the following month at which time she felt some improvement in pelvic pain and pressure, although still found sitting uncomfortable. My last appointment with her was in December 2009. She had had three menstrual cycles lasting 21 days and one for 5 weeks, her periods were not heavy, she had no pain with them and she had a mobile uterus on examination.

A Pap smear was taken and was normal.

I enclose a copy of photographs taken at the time of laparoscopy and of her Pap test results.
